

(This survey has been conducted around A.N. College and Boring Road) Percentage of Youth in politics


According to our findings, we met about 80% of youngsters who are interested in joining politics. They feel that change can be brought about only if politics gets some young minds to shape the destiny of nation.

Percentage of Youth in Sports





Percentage of youth in social work





Percentage of Youth in Education





Percentage of Youth in the Field of Art




