MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

Between

PATNA WOMEN'S COLLEGE (AUTONOMOUS), PATNA, INDIA

And

CHRIST (DEEMED TO BE UNIVERSITY), BANGALORE, INDIA

Whereas Patna Women's College, an Autonomous institution of UGC, and a constituent unit of Patna University, and NAAC 'A' Accredited, offering Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Research Programmes in Arts, Social Sciences, Sciences, Commerce, Management and Education established in 1940 with a vision of serving for value-based Higher Education to youth through academic pursuit for excellence, community involvement and empowerment of women and managed by the Sisters of Apostolic Carmel, a Congregation of Sisters aggregated to the Order of Discalced Carmelites (OCD), having its address at Bailey Road, Patna Bihar- 800001 and website 'www.patnazomenscollege.in' (hereinafter referred to as PWC) and

Whereas CHRIST, a Deemed to be University under Section 3 of the UGC Act 1956 and NAAC 'A' Accredited, offering multi-disciplinary Undergraduate, Postgraduate and Research Programmes in Arts, Sciences, Social Sciences, Commerce, Management, Education, Law, Engineering and Architecture established in 1969 with the motto of 'Excellence and Service' and managed by CHRIST Trust formed under the Catholic indigenous congregation of Carmelites of Mary Immaculate (CMI) having its Main Campus at Dharmaram College P.O., Hosur Road, Bengaluru, Karnataka-560029 and website 'www.christuniversity.in' (hereinafter referred to as 'CU') and

Whereas as PWC and CU (hereinafter jointly referred to as 'Parties') have agreed to enter into an academic collaboration in multiple academic/research disciplines for mutual benefit to the constituent stakeholders, particularly for the Students and Faculty Members of the Parties

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is entered into between the Parties this 8th day of December 2018 which witnesseth as hereunder.

1. The purpose of this MOU is to build friendship and goodwill and foster a relationship that will promote mutual intellectual exchanges between students, faculty members and administrators of CHRIST (Deemed to be University) and Patna Women's College.
2. In an effort to experience the lifelong learning process, both parties are prepared to participate in a formal exchange programme that seeks to promote an academic exchange and to provide collaboration in research efforts.
 - i. This exchange programme encompasses, but is not limited to, the promotion of:
 - a. Exchange of scholars (Faculty Members, Researchers or Associates) and students
 - b. The organisation of joint research projects and publications
 - c. Collaboration in the area of education and continuing education including curriculum development and co-curricular activities.
 - d. Conduct of and participation in seminars, conferences, symposiums and faculty training programmes
 - e. Technical support for setting up Library, Science labs and Social Action (Community Development)
 - f. Other academic exchanges such as Skill Development, Best Practices etc to which both the institutions may agree
 - ii. The implementation of any and all exchange programmes will be separately negotiated and determined by both institutions by way of separate agreement and shall be subject to applicable UGC Regulation/s.

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- iii. Participation in the exchange programme will continue as long as both institutions deem the experience mutually beneficial. It is the intent and desire of both institutions to continue to develop inter-disciplinary knowledge relations and intellectual growth through the exchange of people and ideas.
- Both parties are responsible for their own costs in relation to this Memorandum of Understanding unless otherwise agreed.
 - PWC and CU affirm this MOU by the signature of their officials duly authorized to enter into and to implement the same.
 - This MOU will become effective from the date herein mentioned above and shall remain valid for a period of two years unless either Party terminates the same on three month's written notice to the other. Notwithstanding any such termination, any programme that is being implemented under Clause 2 (ii) above shall continue till its full completion.
 - This MOU will be reviewed at the end of the second year and subject to mutual consensus may be renewed on such terms and conditions as may be mutually agreed.
 - Each Party shall have a Coordinator for the MOU who shall be responsible for organising and implementing this MOU under Clause 2 (ii) above by connecting with appropriate Department/s of the Parties. The contact details of the Coordinators shall be as stated herein and may be changed by the Parties at any time during the term of this MOU by communication in writing. The Coordinators currently designated for the purpose are:



Whereas **Patna Women's College**, a premier institution, whose hallmark has always been Quality and Excellence. It was the first institution of higher learning opened to cater to the educational needs of women in Bihar. The College has been accredited by NAAC with 'A' grade for three consecutive cycles with CGPA 3.51/4 in 2010 and CGPA 3.58/4 in 2015. The College also has been accorded as 'College with

Potential for Excellence (CPE)' status from UGC. The University Grants Commission (UGC) has conferred **Autonomous status** to Patna Women's College in January, 2018 and

Whereas King Sejong Institute Patna. The King Sejong Institute, is named after King Sejong (AB 1397 – 1450) who invented Korean Alphabet, is an initiative to promote Korean Language and Culture, which is supported by the Ministry of Culture, Sports and Tourism, Government of the Republic of Korea. It is established in 179 locations in 60 countries. There are 4 locations in India such as Delhi, Chennai, Kolkata and Patna. The King Sejong Institute Patna was established in September 2014 at NIT Patna Campus. Now more than 300 students are learning Korean Language and Culture every year and it is growing fastly in Bihar.

Whereas Patna Women's College and King Sejong Institute, Patna (herein after jointly referred to as "Parties") have agreed to enter into an Academic Collaboration for Cultural exchange and Cooperation for mutual benefit to the constituent stakeholders, particularly for the Students and faculty members of the Parties. The terms and conditions of this agreement is mentioned below:

1. Purpose is to promote friendly relationship between India and South Korea
2. Exchange and Cooperation Area :
 - Cooperation in Cultural Exchange.
 - Korean Language and cultural experience program according to request.
 - Providing place for Korean Language and Korean Cultural advertisement.
3. Period: 2 years from the date mutually signed
4. No financial responsibility





This Memorandum of Understanding has been signed between,

St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) Mumbai

and

Patna Women's College (Autonomous) Patna on 21-04-2018

The MoU is entered into on the 21st April 2018 by and between St. Xavier's College (hereinafter called SXC) situated at CST-Mumbai, Affiliated to University of Mumbai and Patna Women's College (hereinafter called PWC), Patna University.

The aforesaid *Institutes* are hereinafter referred to individually as institute and collectively as Institutes.

Here-in-after

WHEREAS:

St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) Mumbai, established in 1869 is one of the Pioneering educational institutes in Mumbai Maharashtra, dedicated to the cause of higher education.. The College is recognized by the UGC under section 2 (f) and 12 (B). The College was accredited by NAAC with institutional score of 3.63 '**A**' grade in 2013 (third cycle) and by virtue of getting three consecutive A grades, an Extension of Accreditation was granted for another two years. The University of Mumbai notified ST. Xavier's College as the first Autonomous college of the University from June 2010 and on June 20, 2017, UGC has granted an extension of Autonomy till 2022-23. The College has accolades of **DBT-Star College Scheme** since 2011 and **STAR Status** since 2016 from DBT, GOI and **DST-FIST grant** from DST, GOI, New Delhi since 2013. UGC has conferred "College of Excellence" award in April 2014 & Heritage Grant in 2015. Recently St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) has been ranked 40th in all India Ranking by MHRD in NIRF (2017) ranking and **Best College** award by Mumbai University, Mumbai in the year 2008.

WHEREAS:

Patna Women's College, (PWC) run by the sisters of Apostolic Carmel, founded in 1940, is the first College for women in Bihar. It is committed to the holistic development of women, to make effective contribution to the creation of a new society. It is a constituent college of Patna University, offering degree course and having Post Graduate Departments in Home Science and Computer Application. Patna Women's College, Patna University is recognized by 2(f) and 12(B). The Institution was accredited by NAAC thrice conferring 'A' grade consecutively. The



third cycle which was in 2015, PWC received a score of 3.58/4. An extension of Accreditation by NAAC was granted for another two years. The college has 'College with potential for Excellence' (CPE) status accorded by UGC in 2004.

PWC has also been awarded **Autonomous status** by UGC and **Star College Scheme** by DBT in January 2018. The Institution has completed 78 years of its establishment providing high quality of affordable education and all round development to its students.

Objectives of MoU

The objectives of MoU are:

- a) To promote and enhance Academic Interest between SXC and PWC.
- b) To provide advice for enhancement of quality of education at SXC and PWC.
- c) To exchange faculty and students between the *Institutes*.
- d) To promote research/continuing education both curriculum and co-curriculum activities between *Institutes*.

BOTH THE COLLEGES WISH TO HAVE COLLABORATION FOR FOLLOWING SERVICES:

1. Services:

- Sharing and mobilization of resources, infrastructure and utilization of the expertise from the departments of the college.
- Core research through projects under guidance of experts with faculty and students exchange programs sharing the knowledge bank.
- Collaborative extension programs focusing community services abiding the guidelines of Government of India and Maharashtra and Bihar state Government.
- Skill development programs strengthening the interdepartmental interactions to promote the faculty improvement and student placements.
- **Faculty Exchange:** A faculty member each from both the colleges will be exchanged for a period of one week per semester with the mutual consent of the faculty and considering appropriate dates.
- Travelling expenses for the faculty will be borne by the concerned colleges.
- Accommodation to the faculty will be provided by the host colleges.
- Financial liabilities if any will be borne by the respective college for their staff and students.



2. Technical areas of collaboration:

- a) Provide academic interaction by delivering special lectures at SXC and PWC on relevant topics.
- b) Provide necessary help and collaborations wherever applicable in organizing workshops/conferences and personality development programmes between *Institutes* for enhancement of skills in respect of faculty, staff and students.
- c) Provide necessary support for establishment of video satellite link and assistance in development of e-class classrooms, labs, curriculum, establishments of research labs, training and placement and library, etc at SXC and PWC.
- d) To facilitate the training for teachers and PG students.
- e) Guidance for enhancement in infrastructural development of *Institutes*.
- f) Usage of facilities at Fr. Blatter Herbarium, Calus laboratory at SXC, Central Research Laboratory at Patna Women's College and other facilities.
- g) Exchange of facilities for Star College Scheme.
- h) Mutual co-operation between IQAC's of both *Institutes*.

3. Proposed modes of collaboration:

SXC and PWC proposed to collaborate through the following:

- a) Co-operation and promotion of education and training in areas of mutual interests.
- b) Any other appropriate modes of interaction agreed upon between SXC and PWC.

A specific plan will be worked out by the *Institutes* depending upon the availability of resources. A specific agreement will be entered into for each activity.

4. Terms and Conditions:

- a) Both colleges shall perform the services, the period as may be subsequently agreed by the colleges in written form initially for the **period of 2 Years**.
- b) For continuing education to teachers and students, the financial arrangements will be made as per the mutually agreed terms.



- c) For the visits related to advice and consultancy, travel and other expenses of both the faculty and staff shall be reimbursed on mutually agreed terms.
- d) The faculty members and students can use the library facility and exchange the interests for the same.
- e) Usage of academic infrastructure can be allowed for limited period subject to its availability, approval of Head of facility/department and Institute norms.
- f) Both *Institutes* agree to help, identify and invite faculty members and researchers from the other *Institute* to participate in conferences, workshops and short term courses.
- g) This MOU may be amended, renewed and terminated by mutual written agreement of the Institutes at any time.
- h) Either institute shall have the right to terminate this MOU upon **60 days prior** written notice to the other institute.
- i) On mutual consent of both the *Institutes*, **review meetings** will be conducted **once in 6 months** with co-coordinators.

5. Confidentiality:

- a) The *Institutes* agree to hold in confidence all information/data designated by the *Institutes* as being confidential which is obtained from either Institute or created during the performance of the MOU and will not disclose the same to any third party without written consent of the other Institute.
- b) The above confidential clause under this MOU excludes the information/data possessed by either Institute before entering into the MOU or independently developed and/or information already available through public domain.

6. Duration of MoU:

This MOU, unless extended by mutual written consent of the Institutes, shall expire in **Two** years after the effective date specified in the opening paragraph. However, on review, the MOU shall be extended for another **Two** years by mutual consent.

7. Project Administration:

The client designates **Principal Dr. Baptist Agnel Menezes**, St. Xavier's College (Autonomous) Mumbai and **Dr. Sister Marie Jessie A.C., Principal**, Patna

Baptist

Women's College (Autonomous) Bihar, will be responsible for the co-ordination of activities under the contract, for acceptance and approval of the reports and of other deliverables.

8. Performance:

Both the colleges undertake to perform the services with the highest standards of professional and ethical competence and integrity.

9. Law Governing Contract and Language:

Both the colleges shall be governed by the law of Union of India and the language of the contract shall be English/ Hindi.

10. Dispute Resolution:

Any dispute arising out of contract, which cannot be amicably settled between the colleges, shall be referred to adjudication/ arbitration in accordance with the laws of country.

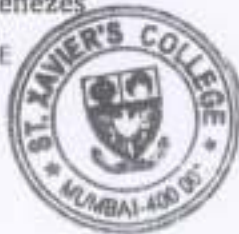
